CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF AND RECOVERY GRANT:

QUALIFICATION AND REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Eligible business types:
 - a. Businesses registered with the Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and sole proprietors
 - b. Non-profit organizations registered with the Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and designated as tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(19)
- 2. Businesses with less than \$1,000,000 in annual gross revenue verified by a copy of the 2019 tax return or annual GET reconciliation
- 3. Have 30 or fewer employees (full-time or part-time)
- 4. Proof of registration for doing business in the State of Hawai'i via a current Hawaii Compliance certificate, GET reconciliation document, or DCCA registration
- 5. Owner must be Hawaii resident
- 6. Must conduct its operations from a commercial location for which the business is (a) the lessee under a commercial lease (dated on or prior to March 20, 2020), or (b) the owner of the location. Post Office Boxes or Care Of addresses are not allowed.
- 7. Business must certify that expenses have not been reimbursed or were covered under another federally-funded CARES Act Paycheck Protection Plan (PPP) or Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL), etc.
- Business must submit a clear and detailed summary of funds expended due to business interruption caused by required closures (effective March 20, 2020); this is a REIMBURSEMENT program; proof of payment required: invoice, receipt, or other proof of payment needed
 - a. Examples of expenses include Rent, Utilities, Payroll, COVID-19 Safety Precautions
 - b. Examples of COVID-19 Safety Precautions:
 - 1. Increasing physical separation between employees at the worksite
 - 2. Increasing physical separation between employees and customers
 - 3. Implementing services remotely (e.g., phone, video, or internet/web)
 - 4. Delivering products through curbside pick-up or delivery
 - 5. Provide hand cleansers in the workplace, including alcohol-based hand sanitizer at least 60% alcohol
 - 6. Placing hand sanitizers in multiple locations to encourage hand hygiene.
